One fellow asked what we were doing and when explained to, he said "Well you're going to find a lot of things with my vehicle" and just shrugged and walked on without caring.



All in all it was an eye opener for our members and I hope the people who had the tickets on their windshields. We are thinking of perhaps doing another blitz near the end of August, if we can get enough volunteers.

AUTO THEFT AWARENESS PROGRAM

St Albert May 13 & 14, 2015

At a crime-prevention roundtable meeting in St. Albert, comprised of members of St. Albert Citizens Patrol, Neighbourhood Watch members, other community interest groups and the RCMP, President of the C.O.P. group, Brian Andersen suggested the use of the newly printed "Auto Theft Awareness Program" ticket booklets printed by AMA and ACOPA as a great way of connecting with the community.

On May 13 and 14, nine members of the Citizens Patrol, six RCMP officers and others from crime prevention groups like the Neighbourhood Watch converged on large public parking lots in St. Albert. Walmart, Costco and St. Albert Centre Mall saw an estimated 250 AMA theft awareness tickets distributed over the two day period. Participants encountered open doors, open windows, keys in vehicles, computers, phones, and other valuables in many of the vehicles. Volunteers were thrilled when they could check the box stating "you've taken care to prevent yourself from being a victim of auto crime – thank you!" There was a lot of community engagement because people were quite curious why uniformed people were out ticketing seemingly innocent patrons of the mall. The curiosity was usually met by a pleasant "thank You" and "good job".



Overall the event was huge successes with several thanks from members of the RCMP Detachment. It was also a great opportunity for the RCMP and the Citizens patrol to be seen together engaged in crime prevention. From Brian Andersen, St. Albert C.O.P.: "The AMA auto theft awareness booklets are a great idea and I encourage other groups to put them to use in their community".

Strathcona County Citizens on Patrol Society (SCCOPS)

SCCOPS has enjoyed a busy spring season including the following activities.

A successful training session was organized by our Membership Director, Helen Curr and trained 12 new members. Making the public aware of COP is always ongoing, so we set up information tables at a local greenhouse/farmers market and at a 55+ Active Living Day.

We promoted COP and the RCMP at the Sherwood Park Trade Fair, a 3 day event. Plus, we participated in the People, Passion, Purpose (a volunteer recruitment day) and the Get Prepared emergency information day. Our local Victim Services group host an awareness walk/run and COP assistance was very evident at the event.

The local detachment sponsors a Bike Rodeo event each year (promoting bicycle safety) which also includes information displays of specialized equipment and departments. MPP, the RCMP helicopter, dropped in for the event. The bomb squad were a last minute cancel when called out to an incident. This event includes the AMA Shredding and lots of fun activities for the kids (and for the big kids). COP volunteers assisted with all aspects of this event - always an enjoyable outing. A few of our volunteers are car buffs - they lent to the occasion with a fully restored "blue & white" RCMP car and a police vehicle used in the recent filming of the "Fargo" TV series in the Calgary area. Very impressive lined up with the RCMP vehicles at the event.



Let's not forget to include the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner hosted by our local detachment, one of the season highlights. As well as COP, the volunteers with Victim Services, Crime Watch and the RCMP Auxiliaries are treated to a great meal and social time with detachment members.

Our Speed Watch program is underway and we have further events pending, including our major involvement in Canada Day festivities.

The events mentioned represent over 340 volunteer hours within a 6 weeks for activities other than our regular patrolling - a great commitment by a great group.

Flag Person Training



Following the Workshop/AGM in Leduc, ACOPA will be offering a workshop for "Flagger" training. Our insurance provider, Jubilee Insurance has given written permission that says COP will be covered in the event that this training is put to use. As well, permission has been granted from "K" Division, provided that this training is used to enhance the training that COP members already have and only to be used in the event that COP comes upon a situation where flagger training would be beneficial and the training would provide additional safety for the situation.

This does not mean that the RCMP can request that COP use this training to control any traffic situation. The training is to provide additional safety in the event that COP happens upon a situation where they can assist and be safe.

ACOPA will cover the costs of this training for any member interested in participating. If any of your members wish to take this training, please let me know asap so that we can be prepared with the proper equipment, manuals, etc...

The training workshop will take place on Sunday morning, Sept 20th in the same hotel as the Workshop will be taking place.

In regards to the Flagger training, the training will be capped at 30 attendees. This is at the request of the instructor who lives in the Edmonton area.

In the event that there are more than 30 registered, to reduce costs for both the groups as well as ACOPA, those who come from the furthest away will be given preference for the Sept 20th training session. The instructor is willing to do a second training session for those in the Edmonton area at a later date.

It would be appreciated if anyone planning to attend can let me know by August 1st so that plans can be finalized.
